Inclusion, Stability and Sustainable Development: Our common challenge

Make health and education for all a lever for sustainable development in isolated rural areas of the countries of the African continent, especially Togo, a pilot country and West Africa, while promoting two-way communication between the population and public institutions is the goal of the international NGO AIMES-AFRIQUE created in January 2005 in Lomé in Togo today present in 12 countries (7 in Africa), the United States and Europe.

Across Africa, there is a growing gap between coastal and inland provinces. Through this process, the contours of growing imbalances between cities and rural areas in access to health care, education and work are also emerging.

The new challenges facing rural populations, especially young people, are leading to innovative humanitarian and developmental medical and surgical actions for isolated and marginalized rural populations.

Collaboration and presence in Switzerland

AIMES-AFRIQUE SUISSE, headquartered in Geneva, works with partner organizations, medical and hospital centers, faculties of medicine, high schools of health and higher institutes, international organizations such as the WHO, the Council for Human Rights. man ... to this common challenge.





Scope of our work

A service linking the Togolese international organization AIMES-AFRIQUE and its field activities for disadvantaged rural African populations with Switzerland and in particular the city and the Canton of Geneva and International Geneva.

- Propose an improvement of the health supply available to the populations, in support of the health system by bringing the hospital free to disadvantaged populations without distinction of race, religion or gender and by supporting in their efforts of sustainable development;
- Facilitate the commitment of health professionals, research and policy and international law through proximity to the international NGO AIMES-AFRIQUE through its affiliate partner AIMES-AFRIQUE SUISSE whose head office is located in full heart International Geneva.
- Strengthen capacity for health, education and sustainable development for all in Africa, Geneva and the world.

Meeting the current challenges

Invest in health, well-being and development of the entire population. Making a tangible commitment to the isolated rural populations of Africa.

AIMES-AFRIQUE SUISSE, *International Association of Doctors for the Promotion of Education and Health*, offers practitioners and also citizens, organisations and international institutions information, training and / or awareness in a process of reduction of infectious diseases and pathologies leading to disabilities preventing a normal life.

We act for the continuous improvement of the accessibility of all, and particularly the poor, to health services and sustainable development.

The lack of curable disease screening, neglect due to lack of information or the cultural taboos of patients and their families, coupled with the lack of financial means to carry out operations early, lead to extreme situations where patients do not can work more and, in some cases, are stigmatized by people around them who are not sensitive to the inclusion of people with this kind of disability or fear witchcraft.

Medico-surgical missions, make possible to show to people who have never been medically treated, that suffering is not inevitable and that there exist in their country, teams of doctors and people who can relieve their suffering, or if necessary, offer them quality palliative care. It is estimated that the impact on the family group in rural areas is multiplied by 6 for a person who is neat or trained.

The Togoles surgeon, Doctor Michel Serge Kodom, is the president founder of AIMES-AFRIQUE, an international NGO which includes national partner organizations in seven African and four Western countries gathering together more than 500 volunteer doctors. AIMES-AFRIQUE is also committed to development with more than 50 projects in specific areas of intervention that are the prerequisites for hope for sustainable development of African countries, especially in sub-Saharan Africa.
